Our cemeteries are communal spaces for quiet ref ect on and remembering loved ones.

The rules and regulat ons herein are to ensure that the cemeteries are managed ef ect vely and used in a sensit ve and appropriate way to meet the needs of the bereaved and those who visit.

It is therefore essent al that Cemetery rules and regulat ons are in place to maintain the dignity and sanct ty of our cemeteries, as well as to inform cemetery users of the reasonable requirements applicable to them.

The Cemetery Regulat ons include the statutory requirements contained within the !

Glossar¥ of Terms, Def ni ons and interpreta on: -

"The Council" means Blaenau Gwent County Borough Council;

means any cemetery being provided and maintained by the council, including those at; Cefn Golau, Dukestown, Ebbw Vale, Cwm, Brynmawr, Blaina and Brynithel.

Apthorised Of cer means any of cer of the Council or its appointed representat ve for the purpose of these regulat ons;

means the area allowed for the establishment of a grave and in a posit on determined by the council;

means a grave in respect of which the council has granted an Exclusive Right of Burial.

means a burial place formed in the ground by excavat on and without any internal wall of brickwork or stonework or any other art f cial lining;

Tradi onal Grate means a grave with a headstone and a kerb set that forms an edging around the grave area;

means a grassed area level with the ground with a small area for the laying of f owers immediately in front of the headstone. An approved memorial is permit ed at the head of the grave;

means a grave, the sides of which have been lined with walls;

means a chamber provided for the recept on of human remains or cremated human remains together with access thereto;

Bprial inclpdes: -

- a. the interment of human remains or cremated remains thereof;
- b. the interment of the bodies of st Ilborn children or the cremated remains thereof;
- c. the placing in a vault of human remains, cremated human remains or the bodies of st II born children or the cremated remains thereof;
- d. the interment of exhumed remains or cremated remains thereof

means the Exclusive Right of Burial in a specific grave and is issued to the owner in the form of "Deed of Grant".

means the transferring of the grave ownership from the original owner of the exclusive right of burial to another person or persons.

Cremated remains sect on provides for the burial of cremated remains only.

means all headstones, vases, surrounds, crosses and any other permit ed or approved item. The sizes laid down are inclusive overall measurements and must be contained within the area of the purchased grave. No burials/interments shall take place on a Sunday, Bank Holiday, Christmas Holiday period or Good Friday except by the consent of the Council whereby it can be shown by the product on of a medical cert f cate that the burial cannot, for public health reasons be delayed.

Not ce will be provided to Funeral Directors and advert sed via ht p://£££.blaenap-g£ ent. relat ng to when interments can recommence following each bank holiday and Christmas holiday periods.

Regpla ons

- 1.1 It is an of ence for an¥ person to: -
- 1.1.1 Wilfully create a disturbance in a Cemetery.
- 1.1.2 Commit any nuisance in a Cemetery..
- 1.1.3 Wilfully interfere with any burial-taking place in a Cemetery.
- 1.1.4 Wilfully interfere with any grave, walled grave or vault, any tombstone or other memorial, any f owers or plants in any such manner.
- 1.1.5 Play any game or sport in a Cemetery.
- 1.1.6 Unless authorised by the Council or being an of cer of the Council to enter or remain in a Cemetery at any hour when it is closed to the public.

Penal es: (Any person who contravenes Para 1.1 shall be liable on summary convict on to a f ne not exceeding £100.00, and in the case of a cont nuing of ence to a f ne not exceeding £10.00 for each day during which the of ence cont nues af er convict on in accordance with Art cles 18 and 19 of the Local Authorit es Cemeteries Order 1977.

- 1.2 Relevant authorised of cers and staf in the Environment and Regenerat on Directorate will enforce the condit ons in this document.
- 1.3 The Director of the Environment and Regenerat on Directorate is ult mately responsible for the control of Cemeteries and the enforcement of the Cemetery rules & regulat ons.
- 1.4 The tradit onal layout of the cemeteries over t me restricts freedom of movement between the grave spaces. Access for wheelchair users and those with limited mobility is severely restricted or impossible on tradit onal sect ons. Lawn sect ons are accessible with the assistance of others or cemetery staf where they are available to assist cemetery users.
- 1.5 When a grave is opened for a burial the excavated material may be placed on the adjacent graves. The inconvenience to people visit ng these graves is unavoidable but temporary. Staf will place protect on boards on the nearby graves to protect adjoining graves.
- 1.6 Because of limited access there may be a requirement on occasions to permit temporary movement of machinery and equipment over graves to prepare other graves for burial. In such circumstances either protect on materials will be used or the ground will be reinstated.
- 1.7 No person shall advert se any services or advert se for sale any item within the cemetery including boundary walls, fences or gates.
- 1.8. The Council reserves the right from t me to t me to revise these regulat ons.
- 1.9. Copies of the rules and regulat ons will be issued with the interment applicat on form and are available to view at

- 2.1 Payment of the prescribed fee, a right of exclusive burial in a grave will be granted for a period of ninety-nine years. This right is subject to the condit ons set out in these rules.
- 2.2 An Exclusive Rights of Burial can be granted to single or to mult ple owner/s (not exceeding 3 in number).
- 2.3 Deceased person's remains cannot be buried or their cremated remains interred or scat ered in or over any grave except with the consent of the exclusive right of burial. If the exclusive right of burial cannot be produced the Statutory Declarat on Form must be submit ed three days prior to the funeral date.
- 2.4 For any opening of a grave subject to the right of exclusive burial, the document must be produced to the Council. If it has been lost or mislaid the person request ng the opening must sat sfy the Council that they are the original owner or right ul successor to the owner.
- 2.5 Every transfer of the exclusive right of burial shall be made and registered by the Council and no other transfer will be recognised by the Council.
- 2.6 Applications for interment must be paid in full and be submit ed to the Bereavement Services authorised of cer at least three full working days before interment.
- 2.6.1 Responsibility for the full complet on of the applicat on lies with the Funeral Director and family of the deceased.
- 2.7 A copy of the Cemetery Rules will be issued with the interment applicat on form. Authorisat on of the interment is subject to the acceptance of the cemetery rules by the exclusive rights of burial.
- 2.8 All fees must be pre-paid whereon a permit will be granted. The current table of fees are available to view at or can be inspected at The Bereavement Services Of ce by members of the public during the of ce hours provided herein.
- 2.9 The Council will not be responsible for any misunderstandings arising as a result of telephone instruct ons therefore all requests must be confirmed in writing.
- 2.10 The Exclusive Right of Burial does not const tute any ownership of land. It is purely the right to have a burial in a selected grave space in a part cular cemetery.
- 2.11 Where the current holder of the Exclusive Right of Burial is alive and wishes to transfer ownership to another person(s), an Assignment of Right of Burial form must be completed. This document is available at or by contact ng Bereavement Services on
- 2.12 Where the registered holder of the Exclusive Rights of Burial is deceased, the transfer of ownership of a grave will require the complet on of a Statutory Declarat on, which must be witnessed by a solicitor or a Commissioner for oaths. O ther documentat on may be required to be submit ed to the authorised of cer may include:
 - > A Will and Death Cert f cate;
 - > Let ers of Administrat on
 - > Deed of Grant of Probate
 - > Any other relevant documents relevant to the Transfer of burial rights

- 3.1 On the grant ng of a right of exclusive burial for a new grave the Council will permit burial(s) under terms prescribed in the Local Authorit es (Cemeteries) Order 1977 (LACO 1977).
- 3.2 Grave depth shall be in accordance with standards laid down in the Local Authorit es Cemetery Order 1977 and any other related subordinate legislat on. The councils st pulated grave depth and subsequent burial fees and charges are for the burial to a maximum depth for the burial of two deceased persons remains. Where historic burials were made to a depth of 3 deceased persons remains the council will only permit the 3rd burial upon invest gat ng informat on from cemetery records and undertaking a depth test to ensure suf cient depth to ground level is available, in accordance with LACO 1977.
- 3.3 The allocat on of a grave space in all cases shall be subject to the approval of the Council which is 7f (2133mm) x 3f (914mm).
- 3.3.1 Should a request be made for an interment that exceeds the allocated grave space then an addit onal charge may be applicable for the adjoining grave space.
- 3.4 The council does not permit the pre purchase of the exclusive right of burial.
- 3.5 The council will, wherever possible, specify any restrict ons on the grave space of which it is aware at the t me of purchase.
- 3.6 The Funeral Director must arrange with a Monumental Mason who is BRAMM registered for the safe removal and storage of any memorial placed on the grave space prior to excavat on for a subsequent interment in order to comply with Health and Safety requirements.
- 3.7 The time stipulated for a funeral shall be that at which the procession is to arrive at the cemetery.
- 3.8 All graves and vaults shall be excavated, opened and filed by the authorised staf. Indicat on must be given on the Applicat on of Interment of the number of interments required within the grave.
- 3.9 No body shall be received for interment except in a properly made and secured cof n. Cremated remains must be interred in an approved receptacle. The cof n/receptacle must bear a nameplate or other suitable form of ident f cat on, which must contain the name of the deceased. The nameplate will be observed by an appropriate member of the cemetery staf prior to the interment.

- 3.10 It is the responsibility of the Funeral Director or other person conduct ng the funeral to ensure that enough people are available to transfer the cof n to the graveside and for lowering into the grave space. The Council shall not take any responsibility what so ever for this process.
- 3.11 The council has abolished all burial related fees and charges for children under 18 years. Future and addit onal interments for adults over 18 years will incur the relevant charges.

- 4.1 The construct on of earth or turf mounds over a grave is not permit ed.
- 4.2 No memorial is to be erected on any new grave for a period of six months af er the f rst burial or if the ground has st II not subsided such longer period as may be necessary.
- 4.3 Second interments a period of three months ground set lement is required before a monument can be posit oned.
- 4.4 Cremated remains grave headstones can be erected within a calendar month of interment if required.
- 4.5 No memorial/surround is to be erected on any grave without f rst: -
- 4.5.1 agreeing with the Environment and Regenerat on Directorate that all the Cemetery Rules have been complied with, and then;
- 4.5.2 obtaining a permit from the Council, upon payment of the prescribed fee, and such permit and receipt must be produced to the Sexton before the memorial is erected.NB: If separate applicat ons are received e.g. for a headstone and later a surround each applicat on is treated separately and the relevant fee must be paid.
- 4.6 Prior to the erect on of any memorial or the placing of any addit onal inscript on on an exist ng memorial, the authorised of cer must approve an applicat on duly signed by the holder of the right to construct and maintain a memorial and submit ed by the Monumental Mason who must be a member of the Brit sh Register of Accredited Memorial Masons (BRAMM). The applicat on must indicate the dimensions, material to be us and all inscript ons, designs and artwork or colours to be put thereon. The memorial must be installed to Brit sh Standard 8415 or any other industry standard, which subsequently supports the Brit sh Standard.

- 4.8 The word "memorial" includes all headstones, vases tombstones, surrounds, crosses and any other permit ed or approved item. The sizes laid down are inclusive overall measurements and must be contained within the area of the gave purchased.
- 4.9 Memorials shall be constructed in an approved material and placed in a uniform manner and in line with adjoining memorials.
- 4.10 The inscript on (and any addit onal inscript on) is to be approved by the Council. Any inscript ons must not of end good taste.
- 4.11 Any memorial erected (or the inscript on thereon) without the permission of the Council will be deemed unauthorised and may immediately be removed by the Council at the expense of the person to whose order the memorial or inscript on was placed.
- 4.12 No memorial can be erected where the exclusive right of burial has not been purchased. Proof of purchase must be submit ed with any applicat on for a permit to erect a memorial.
- 4.13 Every memorial must bear the sect on, row rpermit to f ed by therq ouncil a4

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4.19 No trees, shrubs, plants or memorials will be permit ed on the turfed area except cut f owers, fresh f owered wreaths or art f cial displays. Flower vases will only be permit ed as part of the memorial construct on. If items are placed on the grave space, the Council will not be responsible for any damage caused to them during the course of cemetery operat onal maintenance, and the council will reserve its right to remove any items that is deemed to be a potent al risk or hazard.

The restric on on the placement of memorials are in place to regplate free

items becoming a poten al ha¦ ard to ¢isitors and staf e.g. trip ha¦ ards and f ¥ing debris dpring mo£ ing opera ons.

4.20 Interments in new cemetery sect ons ident f ed as being for Lawn Graves only will be strictly managed in accordance with the st pulat ons of a Lawn Grave, where the grave space will be grassed with only a small area for the laying of f owers immediately in front of the headstone. NO other memorials will be permit ed on the Grave Space.

5.9 All fees must be pre-paid whereon a licence will be issued. The order for the bench and associated works will only be placed once payment has been made. The process from applicat on conf rmat on date to complet on of installat on may take up to twenty weeks.

These regpla ons replace all pre¢iops regpla ons af ec ng the general management, regpla ons and control of the cemeter¥ and shopld be read in conjpnc on £ ith the regpla ons set opt in the Local Apthori es Cemeteries Order or an¥ amendment
